Perfect day for a flag raising. The City of Sault Ste. Marie revealed its new flag today just in time for the 104th anniversary of the Sault becoming a city.

The City colours of gold and blue are the principal colours of the flag. The City's "Naturally Gifted" emblem has been incorporated in the design, reflecting the mountains surrounding the City and the waters of both Lake Huron and Lake Superior.

The design includes a maple leaf, which is emblematic of our identity as an international border city. The colour of the maple leaf represents the majestic landscapes found in our district. The flowing design of the proposed flag is intended to mirror the flow of the St. Mary's River.

It replaces a flag that featured only the city's coat of arms that was not widely flown in the Sault.
