The Official Unveiling. Walk of Fame Restoration Project Complete

The City of Sault Ste. Marie is pleased to announce that its Walk of Fame restoration project is now complete. At an unveiling ceremony this morning, the Sault's Canada 150 Honorary Chair and one of the City's first Walk of Fame recipients, Dr. Roberta Bondar unveiled the display case located at the Art Gallery of Algoma, one of four locations throughout the downtown.



Dr.Roberta Bondar was among the first recipients of Sault Ste.Marie's Walk of Fame in 2006. Due to the wear and tear of the elements, a restoration project was undertaken in 2015. Granite maple leafs are now encased in custom built cabinets in 4 locations.

"It is great to see these maple leaf granite awards back in the view of the public as each recipient represents a contribution to Sault Ste. Marie's history," says Councillor Susan Myers, Walk of Fame Reinstatement Committee Chair. "It is an appropriate end to Canada's 150 celebrations for our community." Over the years, structural damage to the concrete sidewalk caused the original award stones to deteriorate. Earlier this year, Council passed a resolution to form a committee that included Paul Scornaienchi from the Downtown Association, Councillors Susan Myers, Steve Butland and Matthew Shoemaker to analyze a new means of displaying the granite maple leaf awards. Council subsequently approved placement of granite maple leaf awards in four display cabinets in the downtown area.



The four cabinets, built by the City's Public Works and Engineering carpentry shop, have now been installed at the Memorial Tower, the Essar Centre, March Street parkette and at the entryway of the Art Gallery of Algoma. The Walk of Fame Award is given to individuals or groups for outstanding athletic, cultural, academic or humanitarian achievement. Nominations can be submitted to the City Clerk by March 31 of each year. The Walk of Fame award recognition program began in 2006 with a total of 40 recipients having received the award to date.

An induction ceremony was held each year celebrating that year's inductees. Residents are encouraged to stop by the various new cabinet locations and take a selfie with your favourite 'walk of famer' using #SSMfameselfie. All entries will be placed in a draw to win a Sault Ste. Marie prize pack.
